

## Notes from Community Town Hall Meeting, Tuesday, March 26, 2024

#### **Reports from Committees and Subcommittees**

- 1. **Beautification** Pat McMaster (Robin, Rep) Decorated the Lodge and awarded Barbara Pirch with the March Yard of the Month.
- 2. *Irrigation Care* Pat McMaster (Robin, Rep) Two mainline breaks caused repair delays for six residents in March. Sprinkler water coverage will increase in April. Although the length of sprinkler times does not change, water pressure doubles resulting in twice as much coverage.
- 3. *Election Committee* Pat McMaster (Sandy, Rep) Announced election results. Newly elected BOD members are Brad Weberg, Tommy Knight and Dana Giggy.
- 4. **Bereavement Care Team** Patti Brandt (Dana, Rep) Sponsoring a Plan While You Can event on April 27. The committee has initiated a Grieving Buddy System to support the families and friends of deceased residents.
- 5. **Communications** Betsy Berg (Grady, Rep) The primary action continues to be the website. An open meeting to recruit oversight assistance on March 27 is scheduled.

It's been a rough year. The problems with cable identification continue. Urban Dirt has agreed to provide \$25K toward top dressing for damaged lawns. The topic of push mowers is still under discussion. Residents need to continue to use red flags for "no moving" but perhaps circle small areas with rope for partial "no mowing." Matt acknowledged the continuing poor-quality leaf removal.

- 10. **Lodge Improvement** Lisa Kelley (Grady, Rep) Upcoming Community Garage sale April 4,5, & 6. Garage sale donations accepted in the Arts and Crafts Room. And Bingo on March 29 and April 26.
